

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## **KALA UTSAV 2021**

Kala Utsav is an initiative of the Department of School Education and Literacy (DSE&L), Ministry of Education (MoE), Government of India (GoI), launched in 2015, to promote arts in education by nurturing and showcasing the artistic talent of school students in the country. The Utsav gives opportunity students an understand and celebrate cultural diversity at the school, district, state and national level. Kala Utsav not only touches the life of students, but also creates about India's rich awareness cultural traditions and practices among different stakeholders. Further, this can help in fulfilling the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 recommendations, of creating active networking among artists, artisans, art institutions and schools. Another important aspect highlighted in the policy is, "Indian culture and philosophy have had a strong influence on the world. These rich legacies to world heritage must not only be nurtured and preserved for the posterity but also researched, enhanced, and put to new uses through our education system." Kala Utsav is a step towards achieving this goal.

Kala Utsav is not designed as one-time activity but the beginning of a complete process of identifying, exploring, understanding, practicing, evolving and showcasing the artistic talent. It helps students in identifying and understanding our tangible and intangible cultural expressions. Once part of the process, the participants do not just perform a piece from their

living traditions, but rather live that cultural experience. It helps in enhancing various skills of the participants and prepares them as ambassadors of our culture.

Kala Utsav 2021 is 7th in the row of this legacy and was inaugurated on 2 January, 2022 by Subhas Sarkar, the *Hon'ble Minister of State*, MoE, GoI and Rajkumar Ranjan Singh, the *Hon'ble Minister of State*, MoE, GoI, in the presence of Anita Karwal, *Secretary*, DSE&L, MoE, GoI, Sridhar Srivastava, *Director In charge*, NCERT, A. P. Behera,

Joint Director, CIET and Pawan Sudhir, National Coordinator, Kala Utsav.

The program was conducted through virtual mode and was attended by the Hon'ble Jury of Kala Utsav, SPDs, nodal officers and members of the technical teams of all participating States and UTs, and by the senior officials of KVS and NVS. Officers from different ministries and educational institutions were also present virtually. The live event was joined by thousands of viewers through YouTube and other channels.





Hon'ble Minister of State Education Subhas Sarkar congratulated all the participants of Kala Utsav to have come so far, and shared that Arts have an important role to play in the development of high emotional quotient and socio-cultural values in human lives. He said that NEP 2020 emphasises on the development of the inherent creative abilities of every learner and focuses on education that develops moral, cultural, traditional, cognitive and basic abilities in each individual. He expressed that Kala Utsav is a way forward in that direction.

Rajkumar Ranjan Singh, the Hon'ble Minister of State



Education appreciated participants of Kala Utsav for their zeal and enthusiasm in showcasing their skills in arts and that too during the times of COVID-19 pandemic. He expressed exposure Kala that in Utsav develops cultural understanding and appreciation for the diversity among students. He further added that the festival provides great opportunity to understand and promote constitutional values of national harmony and integration.

Anita Karwal, Secretary, DSE&L, MoE, in her inaugural address, expressed that research has proven that only "Arts have the ability to engage each and every sense of the learners" which leads to the development of cognitive, socioemotional and multi-sensory skills. She added that National Education Policy, 2020 has emphasised the relevance and importance of Arts as a discipline. She shared that creativity is required to be nurtured as a 21st century skills in our learners through integration of arts with all subjects and disciplines. She added that the very act of students' participation in Kala Utsav is promoting learning through arts. She congratulated the participants of Kala Utsav and called them "artistically inclined future citizens" and wished them to become the holistic human beings.



# KALA UTSAV 2021 – AN EPITOME OF CELEBRATION OF 'EK BHARAT SHRESHTHA BHARAT' AND 'AATMANIRBHAR BHARAT'

The legacy of celebrating the Classical and Traditional Folk arts as separate identity in Kala Utsav was made possible by providing nine different areas of arts, namely;

- (i) Vocal Music—Classical,
- (ii) Vocal Music—Traditional Folk,
- (iii) Instrumental Music—Classical,
- (iv) Instrumental Music—Traditional Folk,
- (v) Dance—Classical,
- (vi) Dance—Folk,
- (vii) Visual Arts (2-dimensional),
- (viii) Visual Arts (3-dimensional) and
- (ix) Indigenous Toys and Games to invite and showcase the variety of artistic talent in schools.

Additionally, it opened the gates for more number of participation and felicitation of students and therefore more number of regional arts received a national level platform. This way, the Utsav brought together the whole nation to celebrate the spirit of 'Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat' and surpassed all hazards of technical glitches and physical boundaries created by the COVID-19. The increase in Kala Utsav entries this year has proved that art knows no boundaries.

The promotion of different skills; vocational as well as 21st century skills was another attraction of





this Kala Utsav. The process from selecting the art form to presenting it at the national platform, provided them with varied opportunities of problem solving, critical thinking, decision making, creating and expressing. They got opportunity to present through the virtual stage, which is an achievement in itself. Visual arts and crafts, which involved the most important area of heritage crafts, 'the Indigenous Games', Tovs and provided students with due space for their creativity and artisanship. There are as many as 199 creations in this category and the result was a picturesque presentation of the paintings, sculptures and unique Indian toys and games using regional resources. This highlights an interesting pathway to actualise 'Aatmanirbhar Bharat', or 'self reliant India', through school education.









## LIVE PERFORMANCES - THROUGH VIRTUAL PLATFORM

The COVID-19 pandemic and a genuine concern of safety and wellness of our participants and officials was a great challenge, and that was the reason Kala Utsav 2021 was celebrated in virtual mode. This started the process of exploration to find efficient ways to connect digitally. And this resulted in new learning; new guidelines, online orientation of the nodal officers and technical teams. identifying resources and creating resources for the live transmission, training and testing on digital

resources nationwide and live performances by students virtually on the given schedule. And to add to its grandure, the whole event of 12-day long competitions was live streamed through YouTube and other social media platforms of the NCERT and Ministry.

There were 84 transmission/telecast centers from States/UTs/KVS and NVS which were connected with the CIET, NCERT, which was functioning as the central hub. A team of academics and technicians of NCERT worked 24×7 to make the





Utsav a success. Representatives of the States/UTs/KVS and NVS played a great role in making it happen smoothly. Some states had more than one centre due to their climatic conditions. Hilly regions such as Leh, Ladakh, Himachal, J&K, Uttarakhand and some North Eastern states deserve special mention and appreciation for their efforts to make it possible for their teams even during snowfall.

The mention of worthy members of Kala Utsav Jury would be most appropriate here, as they did evaluate all these performances online, sitting throughout patiently. There was a three-member jury for each art form and a total of

27 experts. All jury members were oriented and tested online for their uninterrupted connectivity and that paid back through their smart presence on screen throughout the performances. This initiative not only helped us to conduct Kala Utsav efficiently but empowered thousands of individuals in the effective use of digital technology at their end. And this helped us to follow social distancing norms successfully.





# **MUSIC (VOCAL)**

#### Vocal Music - Classical

Vocal Music — Classical category electrifying was packed with performances. The competition was a synchronised representation India's prestigious most of practices; musical Hindustani and Carnatic. Students embodied these music traditions and the virtual platform of Kala Utsav — 2021 transformed into a cultural fiesta. There were total of 65 performances in the Vocal Music — Classical category, this year.







## Vocal Music - Traditional Folk

The traditional and folk music forms of our country are panoramic depictions of the festivals, seasons, nature, and culture and the country has an abundance of these kind. This diversity was flawlessly addressed during this Kala Utsav, as traditional and folk music was provided with a separate platform. There were total 70 teams which participated in Vocal Music — Folk category. The four-day event of vocal music (classical and traditional folk) performances left viewers mesmerised about the richness of Indian music.







# **MUSIC (INSTRUMENTAL)**

## INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC - CLASSICAL

The Kala Utsav — 2021, passionately welcomed the wide variety of classical and folk instruments of the country. In classical instrument category; Sitar, Santoor, Harmonium, Mridangam, Tabla, etc. elevated the virtual space with the exquisiteness that students created. Watching students immersing into the world of classical music, gave an assurance that these art forms shall remain guarded and grow in time to come. There were total of 61 teams in Instrumental Music — Classical category, this year.











# INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC — TRADITIONAL FOLK


Indian traditional folk instruments are unique by its cultural representation. Instruments such as, Dholak, Rabab, Ektara, Chenda or Darbu, represent the regional and folk culture from where it has originated and is being practised as part of the community festivals and social ceremonies. However, the popularity of such traditional practices has curtailed due to various reasons. The Kala Utsav — 2021, has crafted the occasion to encourage variety of folk and its electrifying expressions. In this category, students provided a musical feast through their stellar performances and refreshed us of our ethnic legacy. There were total of 61 performances in the Instrumental Music — Folk category.



### **DANCE**

# DANCE - CLASSICAL

India, the land of numerous cultures and identities, is a different paradise of dance forms. The colours of diversity have enriched the panorama with amazing classical dance forms, each one with its own levels of expressing Nirtua, Nirtta and Natua and a perfect amalgamation of Bhav, Ras and Taal. This year the Dance — Classical competitions witnessed the gracious presentations in recognised classical forms. like; Bharatanatyam, Kathak, Kuchipudi, Manipuri, Odissi, and Sattriya. As a result, rigid barricades of the regional divisions broke away through the language of dance forms. There was a total of 59 performances in the Dance — Classical category.









## Dance - Folk

India has numerous folk dance traditions and practices which are deep rooted in the regional cultural heritage. **Appreciating** these the existence of dance forms is equal to accepting the originality and diversity of Indian culture. Traditional and folk-dance practices were provided with a separate platform to celebrate the regional flavour. This initiative was truly welcomed by all states/ UTs, KVS and NVS, and there was maximum number of participation in this category, and each one of them represented a different story. They reminded us of an unique past, yet cherished a common spirit. 'Chheihlam', 'Chirmi'. 'Jabro' 'Bangra', 'Lavni', 'Karagattam', are only a few from the list of this captivating treat presented by these young artists. There were total of 68 performances in Dance — Folk category.

The four days journey of classical and traditional folk dances from across the country was echoing the spirit of 'Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat'.





## **VISUAL ARTS**

## VISUAL ARTS - 2 DIMENSIONAL

dimensional visual art The two forms across the country captivated audience with their unique the regional feel and flair. Many of these directly mirrored the social issues and human persistence during the pandemic times. Students artistically depicted "COVID-19 and its impact on their Education". One participant conveyed her heartfelt appreciation for the doctors, paramedical staff, police officers and sanitation workers who stood fearless, with unwavering dedication, loyalty and service for the country in the battle against COVID-19. Participation of Divyang students in this category was highly appreciated by the jury. There were 69 teams in this category.







## VISUAL ARTS - 3 DIMENSIONAL

Expression in Visual Arts — 3D, was also fascinating. The creativity and commitment showcased by the students was truly impressive. The themes varied from historical figures, to decorative and to the situational objects. The craftsmanship and creativity of the students brought life to these sculptures which conveyed many original stories. There were 65 teams in this category.







#### INDIGENOUS TOYS AND GAMES

The category of Indigenous Toys and Games, was the most interesting area of the competitions, where the young artisans were busy creating their toys based on their traditional knowledge of toys and games. Kala Utsav provided this unique opening to the school students to explore, construct and share their talent in traditional crafts and designs. The event received stupendous States/UTs, response from KVS and NVS and the occasion witnessed riveting showcase of numerous toys and games, from as many as 65 teams. Their creations consisted of — puppets, dolls, functional toys, replicas of daily use objects, animals, cities, transport toys etc. Students were

well versed with the technicalities of their toys. They also commented on the use and benefits of the friendly materials. environment the event reminded the need of widening the perception towards crafts and design and exploring domes of integrating traditional practices with education. Exploring such indigenous methods can help students in developing problem solving skills, fine and gross motor skills, creativity, imagination and better learning. Involving in such enhance social skills practices such as sharing, cooperation and adaptability. These toys will be used as reference material for the Toy Based Pedagogy and Art Integrated Learning in our schools.









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## NATIONAL LEVEL ENTRIES

The total number of entries received for the National level this year in the male and female categories was 591, against which 583 students (292 male and 291 female) gave their final performances. Out of these 583 performances there were 5 by the *Divyang* (CWSN) participants. Number of art forms

for the the competitions were nine. Number of States and UTs participated is 33. West Bengal, Lakshadweep and Chandigarh could not participate due to other time bound assignments. There was active participation from the Kendriya Vidyalya Sangathan and Navodya Vidyalya Samiti.

## **ABHAY RUSTUM SOPORI**


